Dividing Tasks by Season

Performing home maintenance tasks based on the seasons can help you keep your property in top condition throughout the year, just remember the list below should always be tailored to your specific home's needs and the climate of your region.



SPRING

Exterior Inspection:

- Check the roof for damage and loose shingles
- Clean gutters and downspouts
- Inspect the foundation for cracks
- Check the condition of exterior walls and siding

Landscaping:

- Prune trees and shrubs
- Plant flowers and maintain gardens
- Clear debris and leaves from the yard

Interior Maintenance:

- Change HVAC air filters
- Clean window units
- Test and clean ceiling fans
- Inspect plumbing for leaks

Windows, Doors, & Outdoor Equipment:

- Clean windows and inspect screens
- Lubricate hinges and locks on doors and windows
- Clean and prepare outdoor furniture and equipment for use

Outdoor Areas & Pest Control:

- Water and maintain lawns, gardens, and plants
- Clean and inspect decks, patios, and walkways
- Clean and maintain pool
- Inspect and address any signs of pests or insects

Grill and Outdoor Equipment:

- Clean and maintain the grill
- Clean and maintain outdoor furniture
- Inspect outdoor play equipment for safety
- Secure and store outdoor equipment before impending storms



Exterior Maintenance:

- Clear gutters and downspouts
- Inspect the roof and chimney
- Seal gaps and cracks around windows and doors
- Remove any dying or unwanted foliage or shrubs

Fireplace and Chimney:

Clean and inspect the chimney

- Check the fireplace for safety and functionality
- Stock up on fireplace essentials

Indoor Preparation:

- Check insulation and weatherstripping
- Test and replace batteries in smoke and carbon monoxide detectors
- Change HVAC air filters
- Test and ensure proper functioning of the heating system



Winterization:

- Insulate exposed pipes to prevent freezing
- Shut off necessary water systems
- Stock up on storm supplies
- Clear snow and ice from driveways and walkways

Interior Maintenance & Comfort:

- Seal drafts around windows and doors
- Maintain humidity levels to prevent dryness
- Check for leaks around plumbing fixtures
- Test and replace batteries in smoke and carbon monoxide detectors
